Abstract : The abstract should be less than 50 words, 9pt Arial.

1. Introduction

A template is a set of styles and page layout settings that determine the appearance of a document. This template matches the printer settings and use of the template is mandatory.

Paper size should be 21 cm x 29.7 cm A4 size, 4 pages maximum. Margins should be set for at least a 2.5 cm (approx. 1 in.) top, bottom, and both sides. The point size should be 9 and the font should be Arial. Do not use hyphenations for the end of a line. The maximum page length is 4.

2. Title section

2.1 Title

Center the title. All letters in the title are capitalized. The title should be in 14 pt., bold font.

2.2 Authors' name(s)

Center author name(s) using 9 pt. Authors' name(s) should appear as used for conventional publication, with first and middle names or initials followed by surname. Every effort should be made to keep author names consistent from one paper to the next.

2.3 Authors' affiliation(s)

Center author affiliation(s) using 9 pt. Affiliation(s) should follow the format: division, organization, address. Abbreviations should not be used. If multiple authors have the same affiliation, one listing of the affiliation should be used, preceded by the full list of those authors on the line above. Center the e-mail address of the first author, in 9 pt directly below the affiliation.

3. Main text

The first line of the first paragraph of a section or subsection should start flush left. The first line of subsequent paragraphs within the section or subsection should be indented 0.62 cm (0.2 in.).

Only the first letter in the heading is capitalized, except for proper names, elements and abbreviations. The heading should be in 9 pt., Arial, bold font.

4. Tables

Tables should be centered in a column and numbered consecutively. One line table headings should be centered above the table. Several line headings should have margins that match the table width. Position tables as close as possible to where they are mentioned in the main text.

5. Figures

Figures should be included directly in the document and placed as close as possible to where they are mentioned in the text. All the figures should be centered, except for small figures no wider than 6.6 cm (2.6 in.), which may be placed side by side. Text should not be wrapped around figures.

One line figure captions should be centered beneath the figure. Figure captions with more than one line should be indented 1.27 cm (0.5 in.) on both margins. The abbreviation "Fig." for figure should appear first followed by the figure number and a period. Captions should be in 8 pt. font.

6. Equations

Equations should be centered, unless they are so long that less than 1 cm will be left between the end of the equation and the equation number, in which case they may run on to the next line. Equation numbers should appear at the right-hand margin, in parenthesis. For long equations, the equation number may appear on the next line. For very long equations, the right side of the equation should be broken into approximately equal parts

and aligned to the right of the equal sign. The equation number should appear only at the right hand margin of the last line of the equation.

7. Reference

References should be in the ACS style.

8. Copyright

The author(s) are requested to transfer the copyright of the paper to ICPOF. The line following the abstract should be "© 2010 ICPOF" in 9 pt type.

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
